

# THE ORCHESTRA « ÁLVAREZ BEIGBEDER » OF JEREZ SPAIN



The orchestra of Jerez “Álvarez Beigbeder” was founded in 1998 by its director Archil POCHJUA. What started as an Orchestra of young people in training became in 20 years a high-level orchestra in terms of technique and music. The orchestra won seven national and international prizes and also gave a concert for the King of Spain when he came to Jerez in 2010. Each year since 2006 the orchestra takes part in the Eurochestries festival, whether it be in the French festivals (In Charente-Maritime, Vienne, Niort and the Paris region) or in the Eurochestries festivals in Slovakia, Canada and China. This orchestra was directed by numerous conductors and played in prestigious theatres. The orchestra Álvarez Beigbeder is celebrating its 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary with a busy schedule, full of concerts and activities in collaboration with the provincial council of Cadiz and its participation to the Eurochestries festival in Qingdao, conducted by Ángel Luis Pérez Garrido.

Ángel Luis Pérez Garrido is a conductor of orchestra, composer, a PhD in music teaching and a professor specialized in orchestra conducting. He has directed numerous orchestras in countries such as Siberia, Brazil, Canada, China and has given conducting classes in Germany, Moscow, Mexico DF, Poland and Brazil, he also took part in academic conferences in Spanish universities, which makes his professional career international. He benefited from the knowledge and experience of great conductors of orchestra when he was a student at the Academy of Chigiana. He received a Gold Medal from the National Conservatory of Music of Mexico for his career as a conductor, and also received the price “Jota de Plata” in Spain. Ángel Luis Pérez Garrido is the honorary director and vice-president of the International Federation of the festivals Eurochestries.
